The exquisite Iguazu Falls are also known as the Iguassu Falls and the Iguazu Falls. The magnificent spectacle of these 275 individual drops has awed tourists, locals and indigenous inhabitants for centuries. They originate from the Iguazu River and are located on the border of Brazil (in the state of Paraná) and Argentina.





In fact, the Iguazu Falls are what divides the river of the same name into its upper and lower portions, a fact that has given rise to several myths and legends as to their origin. This river forms the boundary between Brazil and Argentina, making it a significant part of the political and geographical structure of the continent of South America.



The name of the falls originates from the Tupi or Guarani language, and means “big water”. While the ancient Brazilian tribes knew of its beauty, it was only officially ‘discovered’ in 1541, when the European explorer, the Spanish Conquistador Álvaro Núñez Cabeza de Vaca, came across its awe-inspiring beauty.

VISIT THE IGUAZU FALLS

There are more than 270 falls in an area where cliffs and islets are scattered in a half moon.

MINAS DE WANDA

Take a break from admiring Iguassu Falls to visit the other attractions in Misiones province. Learn about the formation process of minerals including amethysts, agates, topazes and quartz crystals. Active since the 1970s, this mine still produces stones that are used for jewelry and decoration today.




CULTURAS PARK
